Symposium Summary

World-renowned experts in minimally invasive robotic surgery will present their approaches to surgical cases in a multidisciplinary symposium with live cases and concurrent sessions on gynecology, gynecologic oncology, urology, thoracic, cardiac, bariatric, colorectal and ENT surgery.

The opening plenary session will cover robotic surgery and the robotic surgery center from all angles. Attendees will learn strategies for launching a successful robotics program — from a single-robot center to a leading multi-robot institution.

In addition, two half-day sessions offered on Saturday morning will provide participants with access to the Center for Robotic Surgery at South Miami Hospital. These include a session on thoracic surgery with a live case observation and a track geared specifically to Allied Healthcare Professionals. (Space is limited for these two sessions.)

Symposium Objectives

At the conclusion of this symposium, participants should be better able to:

- Compare the benefits of robotic surgery to open surgery and traditional laparoscopic surgery.
- Utilize or recommend robotic surgery for appropriately selected patients who would benefit from minimally invasive surgery.
- Review the current literature on robotic surgery as it applies to each

subspecialty, and recognize how minimally invasive surgery has revolutionized the surgical field.

- Implement safe and effective protocols for the use of robotic surgery in gynecology, gynecologic oncology, urology, general and bariatric surgery, colorectal surgery, cardiothoracic surgery and ENT surgery.
- Recognize the importance of and utilize proper patient positioning for each specific type of robotic surgery.
- Develop and implement an efficiency model for a robotic surgery program.

- Examine the processes for decontamination and sterilization of instrumentation.

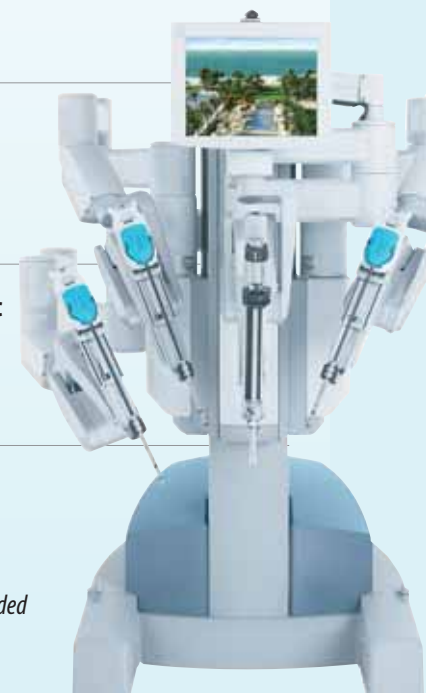
